

The excitement of the Elections had barely died down and Bangalore was eagerly looking forward to some bold initiatives from our elected leaders to support the city's creaking infrastructure. But that feeling quickly eroded when Bangaloreans woke up to a rude shock with rape of a woman just outside her apartment in Fraser Town and rape of a 6 year old child in an upmarket school making national headlines in electronic and print media.

Safety is the right of each citizen. And Bangaloreans always felt safe in the city compared to many other cities in the country. That confidence seems to have eroded with parents getting increasingly nervous about sending their children to school in a safe and secure environment.

We are a society in transition. As a fall out of Nirbhaya, and subsequent developments in legislation and high media coverage, women are now beginning to speak up and report incidents which would hitherto have gone unreported. This is a positive development but much more needs to be done. As citizens we will have to accept that as more women and children feel bold enough to come out and report incidents of harassment, the statistics will go up before they can come down.

Collectively we have to take steps to strengthen our prevention, detection and judicial processes and we are having some productive conversations with the Government and the Police. All stake holders have to come together to work on an Agenda for a Safe City where we have to shed our 'Not In My Back Yard' attitude and start actively contributing to making Bangalore a safer and better city through awareness, dialogue, protocols, guidelines supported by good infrastructure and technology.

Our B.SAFE initiative has emerged as a great platform for multi-stakeholder engagement with lawyers, doctors, trainers, counselors, psychologists, police, parents, teachers, women and child protection groups all coming together to put these protocols in place and action them. We have been vocal in both electronic and print media and part of the Expert Committee set up by the government, bringing the right issues to focus. Bangalore will work together to ensure that we have a long term Safety Road map to deal with these kinds of incidents in a responsible way and B.SAFE with its collaborative platform is at the heart of it.

The other crisis that hit the headlines was the garbage crisis and the Mandur situation which is appalling. Our B.CLIP teams are now active in their respective wards, creating waste segregation awareness, evangelizing organic waste composting, pushing for black spot removal and making Dry Waste Collection Centers functional.

We started with a vision of creating active citizen engagement on issues that are important to enhance the quality of life for all citizens in Bangalore, where we work with the government and the political leadership.

We are encouraged with the progress we have made so far and invite each of you to actively participate in rebuilding our city.
