Namma simple ask:

- 1. MLA to chair a monthly general meeting with civic agencies, corporators and citizen groups with set agenda to enable citizen participation in decision making.
- 2. Padmanabhnagar constituency website to provide relevant data and information with respect to development initiatives in the constituency and citizen demands including local area development fund utilization.
- 3. Transparent and consistent communication on current and future work. Public consultation through online and offline media.
- 4. Communicate legislator's stand on various policy matters that would be tabled in the assembly. Hold consultation with citizens on pressing issues via online and offline medium
- 5. Robust volunteering opportunities for citizens to participate for various causes.
- 6. Internship opportunities for college students and special opportunities for home-makers and senior citizens to contribute to Padmanabhnagar's development
- 7. Contact details of concerned officials (BBMP, BESCOM etc.) must be made available at ward office and other prominent places along with allotted time for grievance redressal.
- 8. Biometric attendance at all the civic agencies
- 9. Quarterly report to citizens on constituency's progress
- 10. Constituency map with civic amenity sites to be put in public domain

The top 5 ask:

Waste Management

- 1. Scientific waste collection system with separate vehicles for dry waste and wet waste. The vehicles to have GPS trackers
- 2. Scientific transfer points wherein waste from smaller vehicles is directly transferred to larger vehicle
- 3. Decentralised waste management system wherein wet and leaf waste from Padmanabhnagar should be processed in Padmanabhnagar. The process to include citizens and information must be disseminated to citizens
- **4.** Temples, educational institutions and other bulk waste generators to be encouraged and supported to be source of zero waste.
- 5. Visual cleanliness to be prioritised. Mark all the blackspots and take measures to beautify and monitor.

Mobility and transport

- 1. Pedestrian friendly and accessible footpath free of encroachment.
- 2. Accessible public transport and last mile connectivity options from Metro stations
- 3. Disseminate information on specifications of roadworks undertaken at Padmanabhnagar.
- 4. Redesign main roads such as Banashakari temple road, Uttarahalli main road and others to be free of bottlenecks
- 5. Publish constituency map with details of CA sites, public roads etc. and provide civic and social infrastructure for residents such as indoor stadium, auditorium etc.

Water

- 1. Few areas in Hosakerehalli and Banashankari do not have water supply. Equitable water supply of 90 lpcd to all the residents
- 2. Overflowing of sewage in few areas such as Kadirenahalli circle must be checked
- 3. Check lake encroachment and rejuvenate lakes
- 4. Allocate annual maintenance cost and ensure RO purifiers are functional
- 5. Conduct hydrological study and terrain modelling to plan water conservation. Rain water harvesting in all public building and spaces.

Women and child safety

- 1. At least one model Government school in each ward with good quality infrastructure and learning outcomes.
- 2. Public places to be well lit, have accessible footpath, sufficient police patrolling and CCTVs to aid redressal measures.
- 3. Awareness on safety and empowerment resources for women across income groups.
- 4. Special focus on young college students, young women and disabled on career building opportunities.
- 5. Carry out crime mapping exercises and include citizens in crime prevention and redressal measures by introducing/revamping support persons and neighbourhood watch programs.

Environment and health

- 1. Maintain equipment at parks. Provide basic facilities at parks such as security, toilet, drinking water and first aid.
- 2. Monitor and maintain green cover (scientific tree pruning) and open spaces.
- 3. Preventive health care measures to prevent dengue and other diseases
- 4. Primary Health Care Centres across, diagnostic centres across constituency.
- 5. Air quality and noise level monitoring indicators to be installed
