Noteworthy Projects Undertaken by Batch 6 Participants:

Education:

Government schools often grapple with challenges stemming from inadequate infrastructure and unhygienic surroundings, which hinder the delivery of quality education. To address these issues at Amruthahalli Government School, Ms. Meghana undertook the task of cleaning the school premises and adorning the compound with inspiring imagery to motivate students to study and aspire for higher goals. Her actions aimed to enhance the school's environment and make a positive impact on students' learning experiences.

Environment:

Ms. Poornima Mallesh took a significant step towards sustainability by installing a leaf composter in her neighbourhood. This initiative has yielded multiple benefits. Firstly, it effectively reduces the amount of waste destined for landfills, thus helping lower carbon emissions. Secondly, the organic manure produced from the composter has found valuable use in parks and homes, diminishing the need for chemical fertilisers. Ms. Poornima's efforts have left a positive mark on the environment, promoting a more eco-friendly approach to waste management and gardening.



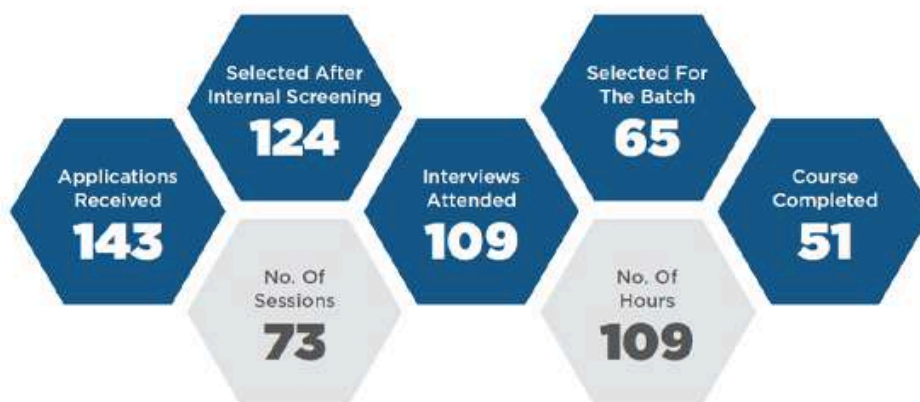
Civic Amenities:

The lack of information about responsible officials for civic amenities often hampers active citizen participation. To address this concern at the ward level, Mr. Vijay Prasad proposed a simple yet effective solution: installing ward information boards in prominent locations. Education and Sports:

The renovated room now boasts a dedicated cupboard to proudly display and preserve sports trophies and prizes, encouraging more students to engage in sports. Additionally, a separate rack was installed for storing sport-specific equipment, ensuring easy accessibility for all students. Environment and Health:

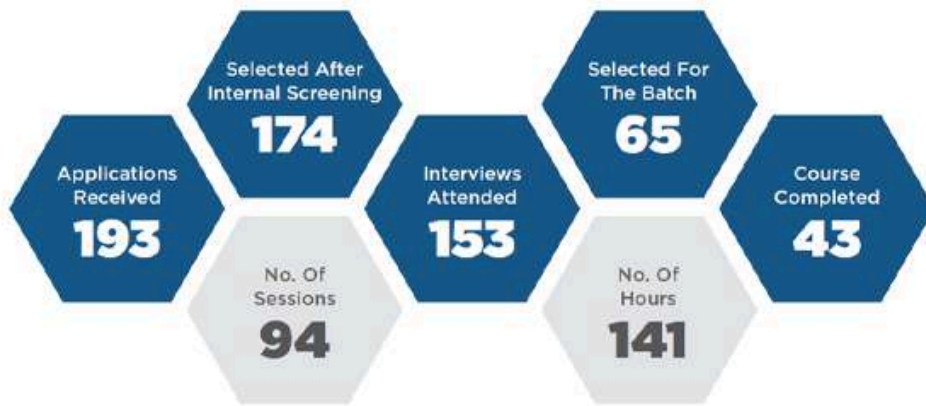

Noteworthy Projects Undertaken by Batch 7 Participants:

Health:

Ms. Shyla Santhoji Rao organised a mega health camp in Guttahalli ward to offer accessible healthcare services to the community. The camp provided free health check-ups for various ailments and sponsored eye surgeries and glasses for those in need. The project aimed to address healthcare needs, raise awareness about preventive measures, and promote overall well-being. Through collaboration, education, and accessible healthcare, the project sought to positively impact community members' lives and nurture a culture of wellness.

Community:

Libraries are essential community assets that promote knowledge, literacy, education, cultural enrichment, and social connections. To ensure these benefits are available to Vasanth Nagar ward citizens, [Mr. Suresh B V](#) initiated the revival of the neglected community library. The project involved cleaning and civic work as a first step toward its rejuvenation. Environment:

Rainwater harvesting offers a cost-effective and simple solution to address Bengaluru's water scarcity challenge. By implementing rainwater harvesting systems, the project promotes water conservation, reduces reliance on external water sources, and ensures clean water availability for various community purposes. About B.CLIP

The B.PAC Civic Leadership Incubator Program (B.CLIP) is B.PAC's flagship initiative that intends to create a pool of informed civic leaders who will actively engage in ward level management and administration of the city to improve governance. B.PAC selects, trains, mentors and supports individuals through structured class-room sessions and field projects. These individuals can either contest municipal corporation elections or engage with the elected representatives or even help in individual capacity as concerned citizens to enable better governance. The program equips candidates with skills in public policy analysis, municipal administration, political landscape, election dynamics, media management, and other relevant knowledge.

The B.CLIP incubator program intends to create a network of candidates that B.PAC and other civil society organisations can work with to solve civic issues, and those found suitable can be endorsed in elections. B.CLIP aims to provide a platform for passionate citizens to enter public service and act as a pressure group to bring in transparency and accountability into the political and administrative system.

Mission:

1. To provide a platform for passionate citizens to enter political/public service.
2. Create leadership capacity at the municipal level to enable better city governance.
3. Create leaders with an interest in public service and a will to participate in the political process.
4. Create leaders who understand the complexities and dynamics of managing a ward, a city and its activities.
5. Create leaders to engage with citizens and interact with the political leadership on behalf of the citizens.
6. Create leaders who can govern with accountability, transparency, and integrity.

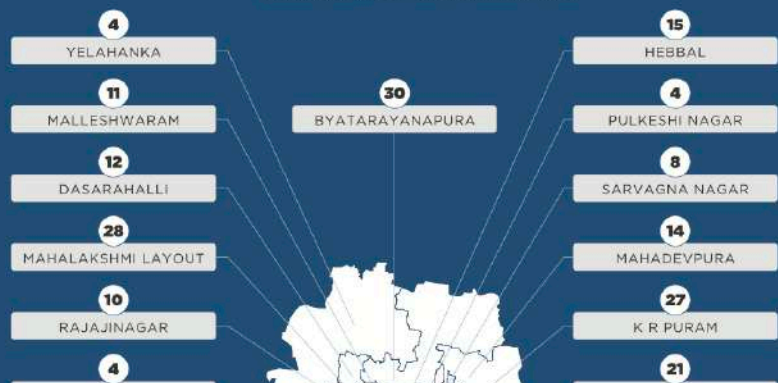
