The third quarter had been especially meaningful because it has allowed us to build upon the foundations we've laid, while also driving impactful change across several key initiatives. We are happy to share that the training sessions for B.CLIP Batch 9 which started in July have been successfully completed and the participants have started work on their individual projects on solving civic issues in their respective wards. B.CLIP Alumni organised Snehashraya Health Camps, enhancing health access for underprivileged. On the occasion of Deepawali, with generous support from Mazumdar Shaw Philanthropy we distributed 33,000 sweet boxes to BBMP Pourakarmikas and sanitation workers as a token of gratitude for their service to the city.

IRR Street: Standstill to Active initiative consistent efforts resulted in removal of 40% debris and waste on that street. We facilitated the installation of scientific speed humps, removed debris under the Ejipura Flyover, inspected bus stops, and submitted a memorandum urging the swift completion of key infrastructure improvements. Together, these efforts are transforming public spaces into safer, more accessible environments for all.

B.PAC and Namma Yatri facilitated auto-driving training for 20 women, promoting independence and economic participation in urban mobility.

Students from Mount Carmel College conducted the Russell Market Redevelopment Survey for the MLA's office in Shivajinagar under the Participatory Democracy Fellowship. The 2024 Arogya City Summit, co-hosted with Arogya World, was a landmark moment in commencing Bengaluru's journey toward becoming India's first Arogya City. Our efforts to foster good governance included a webinar on Demystifying the Right to Information and youth engagement on shaping India's governance future.

In the domain of environmental sustainability, B.PAC joined hands with Toyota Tsusho Insurance Broker India Pvt. Ltd. for a cleanup drive at Bal Bhavan.

Participatory Democracy Fellowship Program: Russell Market Redevelopment Survey



In collaboration with the Office of MLA Shivajinagar Sri Rizwan Arshad, students of Public Policy at Mount Carmel College participated in the *Participatory Democracy Fellowship Program*, conducted on a Marketplace survey for the redevelopment of Russell Market. The fellows conducted data collection and community outreach to gather insights from local stakeholders, including vendors, customers, and civic workers, through questionnaires.

The data collected was shared with the **Urban Planning and Office of MLA teams**, emphasising input from the market's vendors, customers, Pourakarmikas, Junior Health Officers, and Market Association members. This data will guide the sustainable and equitable redesign of the market. The fellows engaged in movement mapping, report-making, and presented their findings to **MLA Shri. Rizwan Arshad.** The program aimed to provide students with practical experience in civic engagement and public problem-solving.


#Youth4Governance Campaign

WOMEN & CHILD SAFETY PROGRAM

B.PAC collaborates with Namma Yatri's Mahila Shakthi Program to train 20 women auto drivers



B.PAC collaborated with **Namma Yatri's Mahila Shakthi Program** aimed at empowering women as electric auto drivers in Bengaluru. We organised an auto-driving training session for **50 women drivers**. This initiative marks a significant step toward promoting women's independence, self-reliance, and economic participation in urban mobility. By equipping women with the skills to operate autos, the program aims to break gender barriers in the transport sector while enhancing their livelihood opportunities.

B.PAC is excited to expand this initiative across Bengaluru, working closely with local civic leaders to foster a supportive ecosystem for women drivers, ultimately contributing to a safer, more inclusive, and equitable city for all.

Ms. Revathy Ashok, *CEO and Managing Trustee of B.PAC*, met with **Shri. Ramalinga Reddy**, *Hon'ble Minister of Transport, Government of Karnataka*, to discuss key measures for empowering women auto drivers trained by B.PAC. The discussion focused on providing concessional rates for driving licenses and introducing government subsidies for auto purchases to enhance financial access and sustainability. In a significant step forward, Shri. Ramalinga Reddy issued an assurance letter, committing to implementing necessary support mechanisms for these initiatives.

Project Malleshwaram Anubhava

IRR Street: Standstill to Active initiative Revamping IRR Into A Moving & Lively Street

The IRR Street: Stand Still to Active initiative is aiming to improve bus connectivity, road safety and pedestrian walkability along the Intermediate Ring Road, alleviate traffic congestion, and create lively streets. We have made tremendous progress in improving the IRR with regular meetings and audits followed by constant follows ups with the concerned departments.



1. Road Safety

On November 25th, scientific speed humps were installed at two highrisk blackspots on the Intermediate Ring Road (IRR), thanks to BBMP Traffic Engineering Cell (East) and its contractors. Additionally, Raised Pedestrian Crossings (HRPCs) were implemented at four crash blackspots, further enhancing safety measures. This progress comes alongside B.PAC's efforts in facilitating renovations and amenities that contribute to a safer and more inclusive city for all. The specific locations of speed humps and signages include the defence land curve towards Indiranagar, near Ultraviolette Hangar opposite Hero Honda bus stop. HRPCs are at DELL towards Indiranagar and near the TVS showroom in Domlur. These areas, previously notorious for accidents, have now seen significant safety improvements, with signage installed before the speed humps by the Bengaluru Traffic Police (BTP). These milestones are the result of six months of diligent work by B.PAC, which included crash data analysis, design preparations, and continuous followups with BBMP TEC and BTP.



2. Ejipura Flyover Cleaning

Since October 2024, B.PAC has been actively working alongside BBMP, contractors, BBMP Marshals, and the SWM team to address the growing issue of construction debris and garbage on the Ejipura flyover median and the defense land boundary. Through intense follow-up, inspections, and coordination, significant progress has been made, resulting in the removal of 40% of the debris and waste. To date, a total of 93 auto-tipper loads, approximately 46.5 tonnes of garbage, have been cleared, along with 96 truckloads, amounting to approximately 2400 tonnes of construction debris and soil. Additionally, five trailers, including 130 construction barricades, were removed to further improve the area's safety and cleanliness. Crash barricades are now

being placed in the medians, and BBMP Marshals are maintaining a vigilant presence day and night to deter further dumping and enforce penalties, despite limited resources. This collaborative effort marks a crucial step in restoring cleanliness and safety to these high-traffic areas.

3. Bus Stop Accessibility

The defence land boundary towards Indiranagar, near Ejipura signal, had long been a neglected area, fully dug up, unwalkable, and poorly lit, posing a significant road safety risk to pedestrians. Recognising the urgency of the issue, B.PAC took immediate action to improve the situation. A one-metre temporary walkway is now being constructed, providing safer access to the Ejipura bus stop (towards Indiranagar). In addition, 10 temporary lights have been installed along the 200-metre stretch, transforming a once dark and hazardous area into a well-lit and safer route for commuters. In a collaborative effort, B.PAC joined forces with BMTC, BBMP TEC, BTP, and the shelter agency to inspect six bus stops in the East zone, working together to identify optimal locations for further infrastructure improvements. This initiative showcases B.PAC's commitment to enhancing urban mobility and public safety.



4. Advocacy

B.PAC recently submitted a memo to **Shri. Ramalinga Reddy, Hon'ble Transport Minister of Karnataka and MLA of BTM Layout Constituency,** highlighting critical infrastructure issues along the Intermediate Ring Road (IRR). The memo requested the priority installation of 8 missing bus waiting shelters to improve commuter comfort and safety. Additionally, it urged the cleaning of debris and garbage in key areas, ensuring a cleaner, more navigable environment for the public and the need for adequate street lighting to enhance safety, especially during nighttime hours.

Lastly, B.PAC called for the expedited completion of the Ejipura Flyover construction, which has been a longstanding concern for local residents and commuters.

Hosur Road Intervention

B.PAC recently held a productive meeting with DCP South and Arcadis to discuss short-term actionable improvements for the Madiwala Police Station and Madiwala Checkpost junctions. One key outcome was the replacement of non-functional street lamps at the Nexus Mall junction, which was taken up with BBMP Electrical to ensure proper lighting, especially in time for the New Year celebrations. The efforts led to the successful restoration of the lamps along the stretch. Bengaluru

Traffic Police installed vehicle height barricades before the Madiwala Underpass, addressing the frequent issue of heavy vehicles jamming due to the underpass depth of only 4.3 metres.

In collaboration with BTP, B.PAC also shared recommendations for improving traffic safety and flow at the Madiwala Checkpost junction through the Suraksha 75 proposal. B.PAC is currently assessing the feasibility of a proposed right turn, analyzing vehicle counts from CCTV footage to inform the decision-making process.

As part of a 3-day training programme for Transport officials, organised by Indian Institute for Human Settlements (IIHS) in collaboration with Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, Government of India (MoRTH), B.PAC, represented by Ms. Priyanka Krishnan, Research & Program Associate of B.MOBILE, conducted an insightful session titled 'Enhancing First and Last Mile Connectivity through Sustainable Mobility and Public-Private Partnerships'.

The session brought together transport officials from seven states, including representatives from OSRTC (Odisha), KSRTC (Karnataka), KKRTC, BMTC (Bengaluru), APSRTC (Andhra Pradesh), TGSRTC (Telangana), GSRTC (Gujarat), and the Transport Departments of Chhattisgarh and Tripura. The session focused on fostering collaboration between public and private sectors to enhance mobility solutions and improve first and last-mile connectivity, a crucial component in shaping a sustainable and efficient transport ecosystem.

Dust amid traffic crawl on IRR fuels health concerns

Bengaluru: Slow moving traffic coupled with dust have rendered the Intermediate Ring Road a nightmare and a health concern for two-wheeler riders and pedestrians. Two of the worst spots on the stretch are at the Ejipura signal and Sony World signal.

"I have started taking alternative routes to reach my office in Koramangala," said Dan K, a resident of Rustom Bagh, Outer Ring Road. "Each day, I commute 7.5km stretch and although my alternative route has more signals, I reach office at least 20 minutes faster. The other road has been horrible for over three months, with a lot of dust closer to Sony World signal. That the short duration of the green light there only makes the spot more horrible for motorists," he said.

Times of India covered our efforts on Project IRR Street: Standstill to Active, an initiative, spearheaded by B.PAC along the 7.5 km stretch of Intermediate Ring Road, which has gained momentum.




